VIRTUAL CONNECTIONS DURING COVID-19

Platforms to help us stay in touch with God and one another.

1. (a) <u>Bible Study:</u> (Zoom)

- ⇒ Bible Studies can be used to deepen women's relationship with Jesus during lock-down by reading, studying, memorizing and meditating on Scripture and applying it to our daily lives.
- ⇒ Decide on topic, theme (eg. Lessons from Women of the Bible, Humility, Love, Forgiveness, Grace, Bible Promises.)
- ⇒ Bible Study leader prepares and presents teaching, pointing out lessons to be learnt, warnings to heed and promises given.
- \Rightarrow **Invite** sisters to share with Questions and Comments.
- \Rightarrow **Conclude** with time of prayer.



(b) <u>Discussion Group</u>: (Zoom)

 \Rightarrow Choose **topics** relevant to the times or those that address women's issues and concerns.

- ⇒ Assign various aspects of topics to women so they can prepare before scheduled time.
- ⇒ After every woman has presented, the leader summarizes or asks someone else (who would have known before) to do so.
- \Rightarrow Conclude with time of Prayer



2. Facebook Groups

⇒ Create Facebook groups to meet the needs of different categories of women eg single women, women with unsaved husbands, women with adolescent and young children, women who are caregivers to aged parents.

3. (a) WhatsApp Groups

- \Rightarrow Establish mentoring and discipling relationships.
- ⇒ Establish prayer chains, post prayer concerns, share prayer requests and devotionals, pray about personal needs, pray for the Church, community, the unsaved, abused women, and those who have lost jobs.

(b)<u>WhatsApp Prayer</u> <u>Meeting</u>

⇒ Organize prayer meetings at determined times for your church members.

4. a) <u>Video Call/ Voice</u> <u>Chat/Texting</u>

- \Rightarrow Stay in touch
- ⇒ Be the friend of another sister especially the elderly. Learn to listen.
- ⇒ Allow sisters to share how they are coping and what they are experiencing. Be an encourager.


